## Car-Free St. Pete Hosts Second Annual Scavenger Hunt Featuring Electric Razor Scooter Giveaway

**St. Petersburg, Fla** – Car-Free St. Pete is hosting their second Annual Car-Free Scavenger Hunt from Saturday, December 12<sup>th</sup> through Sunday, December 20<sup>th</sup>.

Last year's first Car-Free Scavenger Hunt was a huge success with 12 teams participated. It was a timed event during one day where teams had to decipher clues and get from one clue to the next by different car-free modes such as public transportation trolleys, bike share and walking. The grand prize was one free year of going car-free including Cross-Bay Ferry tickets, PSTA bus passes and Coast bike share credit. This year, adjustments had to be made in order to enjoy the scavenger hunt in a safe and socially distant way. Those who join the competition will receive instructions and clues specific to downtown St. Pete via email as well as Car-Free St. Pete swag items physically mailed to them for participating. Participants are also being encouraged to wear face masks and practice social distancing during the hunt.

"We are excited to provide our residents with another annual Car-Free Scavenger Hunt as a way for them to learn about their city and the multiple car-free options," said Jason Mathis, CEO of the Downtown Partnership. "However, we are encouraging participants to wear face masks and practice social distancing while doing so."

The 2020 Car-Free Scavenger Hunt prizes are inspired by St. Pete's latest micro-mobility trends, including a Razor E Prime III Electric Scooter, an annual membership with Coast Bike Share, and a \$100 gift certificate that can be used on the Veo Scooter app.
